Round table participants will present and discuss chosen topic within general subject. We aim at elaborating the great powers alignment and rivalry in the regions of Balkans, North Pacific, and in the Middle East.

Sino-Russian partnership vis-à-vis Western politics of containment is rising in mentioned areas. North Pacific and generally Pacific Ocean is place of the strengthened competition, while Balkans remain the place of the juncture of interests of great powers. Dynamism of great powers is particularly noted in the Middle East.
